**Today we celebrate World Communion Sunday.** In 1936 the first World Communion Sunday was celebrated in Presbyterian churches in the United States and overseas. In 1940 it was adopted officially by the National Council of Churches. The day has taken on new relevancy and depth of meaning in a world where globalization often has undermined peace and justice—and in a time when fear divides the peoples of God’s earth. On this day, we celebrate our oneness in Christ, the Prince of Peace, in the midst of the world we are called to serve—a world ever more in need of peacemaking. Our prayers and music are taken from resources from around the world and the communion table is set remembering we are part of a global community.

**The communion tablecloth** used in worship today was created at our all-church retreat just a few weeks ago. Each circle represents a member of our faith community. The many colors and patterns in the cloths represent the diverse nature of the family of God.
