forgive us.

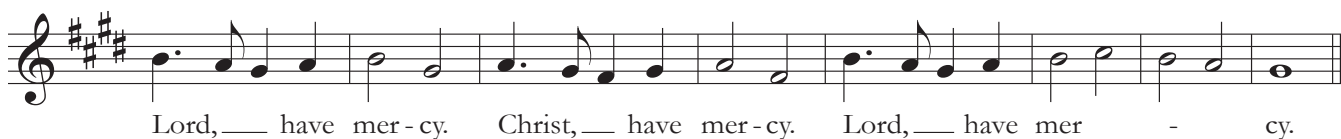
